About the *European Journal of Intelligence Studies*

The *European Journal of Intelligence Studies* is a peer-reviewed law journal which aims to reach the private and public security and intelligence community in Europe by providing them high-level academic information with practical relevance. Public actors such as police, customs services, intelligence bodies and other interest groups within the public administration have a need for information on legal topics, historical reviews, managerial trends and an overview of phenomena including espionage, subversion, sabotage, sects, terrorism and political and environmental radical activism.

The private and public intelligence industry is confronted with the same challenges in their evolution towards becoming an equal partner in the security, intelligence and defence policies and best practices in a region, a state or an international community.

The *European Journal of Intelligence Studies* and its outstanding editorial board of European academic scholars and researchers is a newly launched e-journal, journal and book covering the above-mentioned items.

Topics will include

- analysis of phenomena subject to intelligence studies
- terrorism, religious fundamentalism, organised crime
- espionage, political subversion
- the legal framework of intelligence services (democratic accountability, control on intelligence services, privatisation of intelligence services etc.)
- management of intelligence services (including new intelligence techniques, data warehousing, ...)

The *European Journal of Intelligence Studies* will be published in electronic format. Upon publication each subscriber receives an e-mail mentioning author, title, keywords, abstract as well as a link to the PDF file. At the end of each year all articles will be published in a book and sent to the subscribers.

To mark the launch of the *European Journal of Intelligence Studies* a First International Conference on European Intelligence Studies will be held in April 2007.
